Procedure

- 1. Have each student pick out 24 of the 80 breeds listed to fill in their bingo board
- Read off clues one by one and have students fill in their bingo boards. Students may use the
 breed infographics to refer to in order to ensure they are marking the correct answer on their
 bingo board.

- Swine that originated in Ohio, US with a black body with white legs and face, downward ears (polandchina)
- Swine that originated in Ireland, red ranging from more golden to dark, erect ears. (tamworth)
- Swine that originated in Missouri, US and known for being good mothers (hereford)
- A hair sheep that is adaptable to all climates (barbados)
- A sheep with a fleece staple length of 3.5-6in (corriedale)
- A wool sheep with an average wool of 4-8 lbs (finnsheep)
- A hair sheep that is well adapted to hot, dry, humid and wet conditions (dorper)
- A wool sheep with an average wool of 5-10lbs (cheviot)
- A hair sheep with the ram average mature weight of 180-250 with a long/extended breeding season (kathadin)
- A wool sheep that has fine wool type (rambouillet)
- A wool sheep with an average wool of 5-8 lbs (suffolk)
- A hair sheep with the ram mature body weight of 120-150 lbs (American blackbelly)
- A sheep with a fleece staple length of 2.5-4 in (dorset)
- A hair sheep with the ram average mature weight of 170-200 (st. croix)
- A wool sheep with the ewe average mature weight of 175-250 (hampshire)

- Poultry breed used for laying and meat that lay approximately 150-200 eggs per year that are light-med brown (jersey giant)

- Poultry breed used for laying and meat, has light brown colored eggs. (australorp)
- Poultry breed used for laying and ornamental that lay approximately 200 eggs per year
 (polish)
- Poultry breed used for laying and meat that lay approximately 200 eggs a year (wyandotte)
- Poultry breed used for laying and ornamental that has a brown egg color (cochin)
- Poultry breed used for laying and meat that lay approximately 150-200 eggs per year that are brown (rhode island red)
- Poultry breed with an average egg production of 150 eggs per year (brahma)
- Ornamental poultry breed that lay approximately 100 eggs per year (silkie)
- Rabbit used for meat and fur with a max weight of 10.5 lbs (californian)
